Several of our students also joined efforts through other initiatives to creatively and effectively serve in their communities. Calvin Shikuku and Edwin Odhiambo, two of our students, were publicly commended by the Kenyan President, H. E. Uhuru Kenyatta for their service to the residents of Mathare slums in Nairobi, Kenya-an honor that no one was expecting.

Calvin and Edwin have been committed to supporting the residents of Mathare slums through youth advocacy, program implementation and community cleanups. Both were born and raised in Mathare slums and have been part of OneLife Africa scholarship and mentoring program.

Calvin and Edwin were team leaders of a global award winning Green Project Initiative that provides clean, affordable, accessible, and reliable cooking energy to residents of informal settlements by producing briquettes from organic waste, a product that became essential during the Covid-19 pandemic to residence of Mathare slums. OneLife Africa is proud of Calvin, Edwin and all of our students who are providing the much needed help and inspiring eternal hope to communities in need around East Africa.

It is encouraging to note that OneLife Africa students remained diligent in their High school and university studies despite the global pandemic. ### God Fulfills Promises.

In January 2022, OneLife Africa was joined by a team from Redeemer Lutheran Church, Damascus, Maryland for a mission outreach in Kenya. The time in Nairobi was spent visiting students families in Mathare slums. In Nakuru, the team facilitated a one week University student discipleship camp, while in Narok county, we were welcomed by community elders to a Maasai village. We visited, prayed and sang about Jesus our everlasting Hope. Looking at the events that surround us today, we can all agree that our hope is based on nothing less but Jesus Christ. In the midst of COVID-19 pandemic, class of 2021 graduated from various Universities. Zakayo Omusugu (Zak) graduated from Kabarak University in December 2021. He was sponsored and mentored by OneLife Africa in secondary and throughout his university studies; one of the nine boys that attended the first LEAD Program in 2018; while attending classes at Kabarak University, Zak was actively involved in the operations of the OneLife Africa Student Campus.

Zak was featured in the Summer 2018 issue of the OneLife Africa Newsletter. In that article, Zak shared his personal story of how he joined OneLife Africa. As part of a large polygamous family with many children, he and his mother and siblings struggled to find food and security. Psalm 55:22, "Cast all your cares on the Lord and he will sustain you; He will never let the righteous fall." This scripture has been a source of great encouragement for Zak. With the support of OneLife Africa, Zak's aspiration to pursue an education has become a reality at a level few in his community have realized.

It is said that nothing happens in a vacuum and Zak's achievement is no different. Through the fog of distance and culture it can be hard for OneLife Africa supporters to see the far reaching effect of their generosity when combined with persistence and hard work on part of the student. We got but a glimpse of this from recent events subsequent to Zak's graduation. He shared that on his return home from Camp on January 15th there was a community wide celebration held in honor of his graduation with over 300 people in attendance.

## Our History

**W**ho would have ever believed that a simple dinner with a new friend would change so many lives! It happened in 2003 when Andrew Onguka a Kenyan exchange student at Westmont college in Santa Barbara, California visited Nevada for Thanksgiving weekend. It was Andrew's first time to see the beautiful Sierra Mountains and snow, this was the beginning of a new faith adventure.

At that first meeting we heard the story of Andrew's family, and ministry in Mathare slums an abandoned rock quarry 5 Miles from Nairobi City with a land mass of three-square miles and home to a growing population of over 600,000 people living in 10 by 10 feet makeshift structures. Poverty, disease and conflicts are an everyday reality. The most disheartening is watching children wander through the slum looking for food and occupation. Majority of teenagers join gangs, abuse drugs and engage in sexual immorality resulting in teenage pregnancies and violence. Despite the terrible conditions, we heard about God's protection, provision and support to Mathare residents through a group of dedicated believers who were offering much needed help and inspiring hope in Jesus Name.

The stories were so moving that those who heard felt the tug on their hearts. In January of 2006 a group of 4 men were sent from Nevada just to go and see for themselves the work the Lord was doing there and to pray if this might be something we could help with. No one would ever be the same again after that first visit to Kenya. The team visited Nairobi's Mathare slums, Nakuru and Kisumu counties.

Upon returning, Bridge Ministries was formalized with solidified mission and refined vision, the founding board members worked tirelessly to spread their infectious heart for Christ and Kenya with others. Over the years Bridge Ministries has provided the much needed help and hope to children in Kenya. With support and encouragement from Hilltop Community Church, Andrew graduated from Gordon-Conwell Theological seminary, Married Stephanie Onguka who graduated from Georgetown Medical School. As members of Calvary Church, Andrew and Stephanie were commissioned sent in 2011 to Kenya to serve with SIM. Andrew and Stephanie co-founded OneLife Africa a Kenyan operational arm of Bridge Ministries. God continues to grow and expand this vision in ways that no one had ever envisioned, only Eternity will reveal the impact of obedience and sacrificial service. To God be the glory!
